Types of Christmas Trees Grown in the Greater Capital Region

Most local farms offer a variety of fresh-cut and choose-and-cut trees, including:

Fir Trees (Customer Favorites)

- **Fraser Fir:** Fragrant, soft needles, excellent needle retention
- **Balsam Fir:** Strong Christmas scent, classic shape
- **Canaan Fir:** Hybrid qualities—fragrant and hardy

Pine Trees

- **White Pine:** Soft, flexible needles; a great option for lighter ornaments
- **Scotch Pine:** Excellent durability and needle retention

Spruce Trees

- **Blue Spruce:** Silvery-blue color; stiff branches ideal for heavy ornaments
- **Norway Spruce:** Traditional look with strong branches, commonly grown locally

How to Choose the Perfect Christmas Tree

1. Measure Your Space First

Know your ceiling height and the width you can accommodate—including room for your tree stand and topper.

2. Check for Freshness

Look for:

- ✓ Deep green color
- ✓ Flexible needles
- ✓ A moist, sticky trunk base
- ✓ Minimal needle drop when lightly shaken

3. Ask the Farmer

Growers can recommend the best species for:

- Long-lasting display
- Allergy-friendly options
- Strong branches for ornaments
- Trees suited for warm vs. cool rooms

Tips for Caring for Your Tree

Water, Water, Water

Place your tree in water within an hour of cutting. A fresh tree can drink a gallon or more on day one—keep checking the stand!

Keep It Cool

Avoid placing the tree next to fireplaces, radiators, or heating vents.

Use Plain Water Only

Tree preservatives aren't necessary—plain water is best for hydration.
